

2016 MPSSAA Basketball Quiz #15

1. Following a goal by A-1, the ball is inadvertently deflected under the bleachers. When does the throw-in begin and when does the ball become alive?
2. Team A is awarded an alternating possession (A.P.) throw-in. A-1's inbound pass is intentionally kicked by B-1. Does Team A retain the A.P. arrow? Yes or No?
3. Team A is not in the bonus when B-1 pushes A-1. The spot of the foul is the nearest sideline. To inbound the ball, A-3 jumps into the air over the designated spot and passes the ball inbounds. Is this legal? Yes or No?
4. A-1 receives a pass and establishes his/her right foot as the pivot foot. While faking a pass, A-1 lifts the pivot foot and stands on the left foot alone while undecided as to what to do. Has A-1 traveled in this situation? Yes or No?
5. A-1 dives for a loose ball and slides after gaining control. A-1 is in a position either on his/her back or stomach. From this position can A-1 roll over? Yes or No?

Answers:

1. The trail official should stop the clock. The throw-in begins and the ball becomes alive when it is at the disposal of Team B; Case Book 4.42.3 (a).
2. Yes; Case Book 4.42.5, Situation.
3. Yes; Case Book 4.42.6.
4. No; Case Book 4.44.3, Situation B.
5. No; Case Book 4.44.5, Situation B.

Teaching Points:

1. Review when the ball becomes alive.
2. Review when the ball is at the disposal of a player.
3. Put the ball in the correct throw-in spot after a violation or foul.
4. Make sure when adjudicating a traveling violation, that it is an infraction and not something that is out of the ordinary and legal by rule.
5. Read five Case Book plays every day.
