

2018 MPSSAA BOYS LACROSSE QUIZ #2

CALLS YOU JUST HATE TO MAKE, BUT ARE RULES NONETHELESS

1. The playing field is missing a complete center line or “shadow line” which goes through the logo. RULING:
 - a. Simply face-off and play the game.
 - b. Award the opening face-off to visiting team.
 - c. “Unsportsmanlike conduct” and award the ball to visiting team.
 - d. Refuse to play the game until line is added.

2. In NFHS rules, eye black is restricted to a single stroke below the eye socket:
 - a. Don’t make a big deal out of it...ignore and play the game.
 - b. As in NCAA, this is allowed by rule.
 - c. Make them wipe it off before game begins.
 - d. Just make sure there is no writing in the eye black and play the game.

3. All undergarments must match:
 - a. They must be white, gray, or predominant team color and all must match.
 - b. If they don’t match, have them tuck in at beginning of the game and leave it at that.
 - c. Don’t sweat it, after all, you don’t want to major in the minors.
 - d. a and b above.

4. Stick checks:
 - a. NFHS recommends 2-4 during a game.
 - b. Head of the stick must permit a scorecard to fit or at least have a 3-inch opening at 1.25 inches up from the throat.
 - c. Check sticks in center of field away from players and coaches.
 - d. All of the above.

5. Mouthpieces:
 - a. Recent rule change makes it an unsportsmanlike conduct foul.
 - b. Make the call early and frequently – no talk necessary.
 - c. Mouthpiece ALWAYS comes out during play.
 - d. When possible, be preventative and coach player to properly wear.

6. Simultaneous fouls:
 - a. Simultaneous fouls by both teams nullifies any goal scored.
 - b. Personal foul by defense, followed by technical by offense, results in both serving penalty time.
 - c. Live ball, simultaneous technical fouls cancel each other.
 - d. a and c above.

7. Conduct foul:
 - a. Reserved primarily for player-to-player disparaging comments.
 - b. Meant to send a signal to help control a coach who either speaks out or comes out onto the field.
 - c. Always results in a time-serving foul.
 - d. Could never be used as a dead ball foul to award possession.

8. Man down:
 - a. A team which is not attacking the goal may be warned for stalling.
 - b. Like NCAA, a team which is down a man can NOT be warned for stalling.
 - c. As a period comes to an end when both teams are down a man, ball is awarded to team in possession.
 - d. As a period begins, one team is down a man for 1 minute and the other is down a man for 3 minutes. Ruling: Team with lesser penalty time gets the ball.

9. Period comes to an end:
 - a. "Play on" means team in possession or entitled to possession retains possession to begin next period.
 - b. Each team has a man in the penalty box, so team with lesser penalty time gets possession to begin next quarter.
 - c. Sounding of the horn means the end of a period, even when there is a shot released before the horn.
 - d. Flag down and loose ball as period ends means, in the absence of any fouls between periods, the offended team will start next period in possession.

10. NOCSAE game balls:
 - a. "Meets NOCSAE Standard" must be labeled on ball to be considered legal for play.
 - b. Should have NFHS stamped with logo on ball.
 - c. Game can be played without NFHS stamp, but should report to assigning authority.
 - d. All of the above.
