

## MPSSAA Quiz #2: Oh that Goalie!

1. There is a loose ball in front of the goal circle and no opponents around, the GK steps out with her front foot, keeping her back foot on the goal circle line and scoops up the ball in her stick. What can she legally do next?
  - a. She may continue on her way out with the ball.
  - b. She may continue out with the ball but immediately toss it back into the goal circle
  - c. She may pick it up the ball and step back into the goal circle while possessing the ball
  - d. A and C only
  - e. All of the above
  
2. The goalkeeper makes a save in her goal circle and puts the ball down in the back of the goal circle, she leaves, a deputy steps in to continue play. Which of the following is/are Legal?
  - a. The deputy may pick up the ball with her hand, place it in her stick and pass it out to a teammate
  - b. The deputy may run out with the ball
  - c. The Deputy may pass the ball to a teammate, remain in the goal circle and the ball can be passed back to the deputy in the goal circle.
  - d. B and C only
  - e. All of the above
  
3. Team A calls for a time out after you have started the 10 second count you are at 4 when the time out was called. How is play restarted?
  - a. Team A restarts play on the closest dot
  - b. The Team A Goalkeeper starts with the ball in the goal circle with a fresh 10 second count
  - c. Any player from Team A may start with the ball in the goal circle and the count continues from 4 upward.

- d. ONLY the Team A Goalkeeper may start with the ball in the goal circle and the count continues from 4 upward
4. As an attacker is on a fastbreak and to cut down the shooter's angle the goalkeeper steps out with one foot keeping the back foot in the goal circle, what should the official do?
- a. Whistle shooting space on the goalkeeper and place the attacker on the 8m, putting the Goalkeeper behind
  - b. Whistle shooting space on the goalkeeper and allow the goalkeeper to remain in the goal circle
  - c. Let play continue as the goalkeeper is considered in the goal circle
  - d. Whistle for shooting space on the goalkeeper and if the attacker shoots consider carding for dangerous propel on the shooter
5. When the ball remains in the goal circle and is not cleared in 10 seconds, what shall the official do?
- a. Start the count over and allow the play to continue
  - b. Whistle a goal circle violation and set the ball on the dot and the goalkeeper remains in her circle
  - c. Whistle a goal circle violation and set the ball on the dot and put the goalkeeper behind
  - d. Whistle a minor foul on the goalkeeper and set the ball on the top of the 12 meter fan, goalkeeper remains in the goal circle and say "Indirect" prior to starting play with a whistle
