MPSSAA News and Notes

Board of Control Update

The MPSSAA Board of Control held its annual winter meeting on December 9, 2010. The following are highlights from the meeting.

- * Accepted and approved the new classifications and region alignments for the 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 school years from the classification committee. The classifications can be found on page two of this edition of the Scout.
- * Approved the 2010 Spring Bulletins and recommended the executive council to review the girl's lacrosse penalty chart as outlined in the US Lacrosse rules for girl's lacrosse at their February meeting.
- * Accepted the 2010 spring and fall finacial report, 2010 fall sports' reports and the 2010-11 winter sports' updates.
- * Accepted and approved new language requiring concussion awareness courses by all coaches. The amendment will now be moved to local school system superintendents for approval prior to consideration before the state board of education. The new proposed language states:
 - (4) All coaches shall have completed a MPSSAA approved concussion awareness/management program.

Basketball Draw

The MPSSAA will host the boys and girls basketball tournament draw on Feb. 20, 2011. The draw will be held at Long Reach High School. Check the basketball page on the www.MPSSAA.org Web site for the latest news regarding directions and the start time of the draw. Coaches, athletes, and fans are encouraged to attend.

Coaches are reminded that the tournament will allow the top four teams in each region to be seeded based on their regular-season win-loss record (excluding holiday tournaments). The remaining teams in each region will be placed on the bracket by a blind draw. Region directors must verify and submit to the state committee on the morning of the draw the official records of each of their region's teams through Saturday, Feb. 19.

MPSSAA and Wilson To Continue Long Standing Tradition

The MPSSAA and Wilson Sporting Goods have reached an agreement for Wilson to continue to be the official football and tennis ball of the MPSSAA State Championships. Wilson will supply football for the MPSSAA State Championships through the fall of 2015 and tennis balls for the tennis state championships through the spring of 2014. The MPSSAA appreciates Wilson's continue sport of high school athletics.

New Committee Directors Set To Take Over

The MPSSAA is proud to welcome three new sport committee chairs for girl's basketball, tennis and football. Lynette Mitzel, Supervisor of Athletics for Baltimore County, will direct the girl's basketball committee beginning with the 2010-11 winter sports season. Taking over as chair of the tennis committee for the 2011 spring sports season will be Russell Maxwell from DuVal High School in Prince George's County. The football committee will welcome their fourth committee chair since 1974 when Mike Calhoun, Principal of Allegany High School, takes over as director at the football committee meeting on January 27.

EXECUTIVE'S

CORNER

A frequent request to the MPSSAA is that a waiver be granted for one of the Maryland State Board of Education Regulations. While not specifically stated, the tone of most requests is such that granting the plea is a no brainer, and in the interest of justice it will no doubt be approved. Most request are also couched within the argument, "it is for the kids." That statement is frequently and loosely used to imply either sympathy or to trump any other considerations. Each of the requests are forwarded on the premise that a waiver is the only viable solution to the problem.

Unfortunately, the regulations of the Maryland State Board of Education do not make provisions for waivers. As one might expect there is sound reasoning behind that aspect of the rules. For example: Under what circumstances would waivers be granted? Would some receive a waiver while others are denied? Would some petitions be more credible than others? Would some try to game the system through a waiver? Would people lose trust that rules were being applied evenly? Does a waiver become a new rule? Would the so called glamour schools be perceived as getting waivers more frequently than others? Would schools with stronger parent, alumni or political backing receive greater consideration? I could go on but you get the point.

Athletic rules need to be exacting. You are either safe or out, it is either fair or foul, you are either in or out of bounds. Likewise, administrative athletic rules need to be equally straight forward. Back sliding in the face of controversy is the ultimate affront to our student athletes. Consistent rules applied equally to all are one of the greatest gifts adults can give to student athletes. Our athletes depend on us for the consistency of fairness. School athletics provides the ideal classroom to learn those valuable lessons.

Let us also not forget that we are talking about high school athletics. This is not life and death, war and peace, or the foundations of western civilization. The goals of our program are designed to teach values and citizenship. Losing site of these big picture goals is a common mistake of those who feel their situation requires a different application of the rules.

Finally, a redeeming aspect of all MPSSAA post season tournaments less football is that either through the county or regional championships all students and teams have an opportunity to participate and succeed. While some might encounter more obstacles' than others, the value of perseverance is a wonderful trait to learn. Learning to cope with setbacks and adversity can only strengthen the character of those that participate.
