MPSSAA News and Notes

Board of Control Update

The MPSSAA Board of Control held its annual spring meeting on April 26, 2013. The following are highlights from the meeting.

- * Approved the 2013 Fall Bulletins and 2013-14 Winter Bulletins.
- * Accepted the 2013 winter financial report and the 2013 spring sports' updates.
- * Updates on the Minds in Motion Scholarship, Student Leadership Conference, and recently approved State Legislation.
- * Updated membership on the timeline for potential COMAR revisions.
- * Announced the First Practice Date as August 14, 2013.
- * Established the seedings for the 2013-14 state tournaments as well as the concept of designing a 24-year rotation.

2013-14 Seeds Announced

Semifinal pairings for the 2013-14 MPSSAA state tournaments were determined by draw at the April 26, 2013, meeting of the Board of Control. The semifinal pairings in the state tournament are as follows:



The MPSSAA Executive Council also voted to establish a 24-year cycle beginning with the 2013-14 matchups. The above pairings will be Year One of a 24-year rotation. The complete rotation can be found on page 3.

Fall Starting Date

On Tuesday, April 23rd the Maryland State Board of Education approved moving the first day of Fall practice to Wednesday, August 14, 2013. The three additional practice days were requested by the MPSSAA in order to compensate for lost practice time due to heat acclimatization restrictions. All other projected regular season and playoff dates remain as scheduled. A sample calendar can be found on page 4 of this newsletter. COMAR Revisions Update

On Tuesday, April 23rd the Maryland State Board of Education agreed to consider proposed comprehensive revisions to the athletic regulations at their July meeting. The current rules and regulations remain intact until official notification of a change.

MPSSAA News and Notes

Non-School Teams

There are some significant MPSSAA bylaw amendments and interpretation adjustments that are under consideration. With changes of this nature, rumor and speculation always precedes the facts. In an effort to help folks from getting too far ahead of reality, below are some explanations of the changes to interpretations made at the December 6, 2012 Board of Control meeting regarding non-school teams and team camps.

While the regulation prohibiting school teams from attending a camp remains in place, those restrictions do not extend to non-school teams. The key words are <u>non-school teams</u>. That means that a team attending a camp along with a member of a school coaching staff must be able to clearly demonstrate that there is no school affiliation what-so-ever. That includes but is not limited to funding, organizational meetings, uniforms, equipment, etc.

The following language was adopted by the Board of Control and should serve as a directive for those coaches wishing to be associated with non-school teams beginning after the last 2013 spring state championship game.

Any paid or volunteer coach at a member school may coach a non-school team provided the team has no direct affiliation with the school. When coaching non-school teams, including returning school players on non-school teams, the following criteria shall be observed:

- a. The non-school team may not use a name directly connected with the school.
- The non-school team may not use school uniforms, equipment or funds.
- c. The non-school team may not use school facilities except as allowed by local school system guidelines.
- d. The non-school team must meet local school system standards of a non-school team.
- e. The number of returning school players on the non-school team is limited according to the following timeframe.
 - 1. From the start of the fall sports season as defined in Regulation .03, to the last state championship game of the spring season, the outside teams roster does not exceed 80% of the returning players of what would constitute a starting lineup in that sport OR a modified version thereof. i.e., 7-on-7 football, 3-on-3 basketball, indoor soccer, indoor lacrosse, etc.
 - From the last state championship game of the spring season to the first day of fall practice, the outside team roster is unrestricted on the number of returning players.

Who Can Attend

The conference is open to rising high school sophomores, juniors, and seniors who participate in interscholastic athletics at MPSSAA member schools. Those who have attended a previous conference are not eligible to attend.

Initial registration allots each school two (preferably one male and one female) representatives. Schools may also register alternates with their two delegates and those alternates will be accepted after May 10 based on space availability. The ca-

pacity of the conference is 400 student-athletes. Last year's conference was at capacity.

Cost

FREE – There is no registration fee. The conference is put on as a service of the MPSSAA and conference sponsors.

Transportation

Student transportation to and from the event will be the responsibility of participants. Please try to arrive by 8 a.m. to ensure registration runs smoothly and begin the conference promptly at 8:45 a.m.

Meals

Lunch will be provided by the MPSSAA.

Attire

Students should wear shorts of proper length, t-shirt and tennis shoes.

MPSSAA 24-year Semifinal Seeding Cycle

The MPSSAA Executive Council approved establishing a 24-year semifinal seeding cycle based on the 2013-14 pairings as established at the April 26, 2013 Board of Control meeting. The pairings below ensure over any four-year cycle each region will be seeded one through four once, each region will play the other regions four times during a 12-year cycle and semifinal pairings and seeds will not be repeated in consecutive years. While rescheduling so far into the future is at best speculative, the cycle below provides direction into the foreseeable future.

The suggested guidelines for local consideration are intended to provide direction to school teams for the acclimatization of student-athletes during preseason practice period required prior to the first play date. Each local school system is required to have their own policy for heat acclimatization and schools should check with their respective local school system regarding the specifics of their local policy.

Spring Coaches: What You Need To Know Come Region and State Tournament Time

As schools conclude the regular season and begin Region and State Tournament play, a number of items will be required by schools as they progress through the tournament to ensure a smooth operation of the state tournament. The following is a general chronological checklist for coaches and athletic administrators to use as they advance through the tournament.

Regular Season

- ☐ Review Tournament Bulletin: Make sure you have reviewed your state tournament bulletin. If for some reason you do not have a bulletin you may find a copy on the MPSSAA website on your sport specific page. Most frequently asked questions can be answered in the bulletin.
- □ Contact Regional Director: Make sure you are in contact with you regional director prior to the end of the regular season. It is the responsibility of the school to work with regional directors to accurately report schedules, results and records for the purpose of tournament seeding. Regional directors can be found in the tournament bulletin and on each sport page of mpssaa.org.
- □ Submit Final Regular Season Record: At the conclusion of your final game prior to the draw date, contact your regional director with your record. Region directors must verify and submit to the state committee by the the draw the official records of each of their region's teams.

Regional Tournament

□ **Draw Day:** The MPSSAA will conduct all draws for the spring sports season via conference call with the each sport committee director. After the draw is complete it will be posted on the MPSSAA website. Schools should identify their respective matchup and plan accordingly to setup all necessary logistics for the regional games.

- ☐ Reporting Scores: At the conclusion of each regional game, coaches should call in scores using the contact information on page five. This will allow the MPSSAA to update brackets accordingly. Failure to report scores significantly hinders the ability of the MPSSAA to update brackets and provide athletic administrators the necessary time to schedule the logistics for the next round of contests.
- □ Regional Quarterfinal Round Champions Team Entry Form: Schools that advance past the Regional Quarterfinals have an obligation to submit a **team photo** and **team entry form** to the MPSSAA. The deadline for these submissions is 4 p.m. the day following their quarterfinal win. Team entry forms and photos allow the MPSSAA to have all necessary information for the state tournament. Accuracy is ex-

tremely important as this information will be duplicated in the state playoff book and the state finals t-shirts.

Regional Final Champion: Regional champions will be awarded a team plaque and individual certificates to members of the team. At the conclusion of the regional final game, schools should contact their regional director amd submit the score of the regional final game and their season record, including all tournament games.

State Tournament

- Media Forms: Schools competing at the state semifinals need to fill out and bring copies of the media form to the their state semifinal contest. Media forms are found on the respective sport pages of mpssaa.org. These forms are important to highlight school programs as media outlets who may not typically cover you during the season will be writing articles on your success. These forms will be provided to media at the state semifinals and finals.
- Playoff Magazine: The MPSSAA official state playoff program magazine will be given to all state semifinal participants. Team photo, roster and school information for each state semifinal participating team will be highlighted in the book. All information is based upon the team entry form so accuracy and spelling is important.
- State Tournament: Schools advancing to the state semifinals and finals should refer to the MPSSAA bulletin for
 state finals information. Each school will have an opportunity to compete for the state championship in their classification. Based on your seed (South-1, West-2, North-3
 and East-4) and your opponent's seed will determine
 whether you are the designated home or away team for
 both your semifinal and final matchup. Be safe and bring
 both sets of uniforms. Schools should encourage their fan
 base to check the MPSSAA Fan Focus for event information and direct them to purchase state final tickets online
 to avoid lines at the gate the day of the event.
